Reference to the matter of the gasoline tax. It is decided by the Board that said tax is necessary and a resolution was offered to that effect by Trustee "Len Jones" which was adopted by the Board.

Where upon Trustee "Len Jones" offered the following ordinance:

Ordinance No. 49

An ordinance providing for the regulation and licensing of occupations, callings and trades and fixing a penalty for the violation of the same.

Be it ordered by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Nixa, Missouri as follows:

"Section 1" Every person, firm or corporation engaged in the business and offering for sale in the Village of Nixa, Missouri, gasoline, bonzine, or naptha, and every person, firm or corporation storing the same for sale in said Village and every person, firm or corporation transporting the same over the streets, alleys and other public places in the Village of Nixa for the purpose of storage or sale in said Village of Nixa shall procure a license therefore unless said persons are now running a business and paying a license tax thereon as per other ordinance of said Village of Nixa.

"Section 2" Every person, firm or corporation in the business described in the foregoing section in addition to said license tax provided for by ordinance of the Village of Nixa, shall on or before the 1st day of each month and each succeeding month during the year and years thereafter on the said date of each month and during the time any license as named in Section 1, hereat pay to the City Clerk of said Village of Nixa a sum equal to one cent (\$.01) for each gallon of gasoline benzine or naptha sold, transported or stored by such persons, firm or corporation in the Village of Nixa, Missouri and shall pay the said one cent per gallon of gasoline, benzine or naptha sold, transported or stored in said Village of Nixa, Missouri. Whether the said persons pay any other license tax or not.

"Section 3" Every person, firm or corporation in the business described in Section 1 of this ordinance shall keep an accurate record of all sales of gasoline, benzine, or naptha and shall on the 1st day of each succeeding month file with the City Clerk a sworn statement of the number of gallons of gasoline, benzine, and naptha sold, stored or transported for sale in said Village of Nixa during the preceding month. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to investigate and determine the correctness and accuracy of the statement herein required, and to determine the amounts of the payments due under the provisions of Ordinance, and for such purpose shall have access at all reasonable times to the books, papers, documents and reports bearing on the number of gallons of gasoline, benzine or naptha purchased, sold, stored or transported. The sworn statement herein required shall be in the form prescribed by the city or village clerk and shall contain such additional information he may deem necessary for the purpose of enforcing this ordinance.

"Section 4" That all moneys collected under Section 1, 2 and 3 of this Ordinance shall be kept in a separate account and shall be used expended for repair, upkeep, building and maintenance of the public streets and highway of the Village of Nixa, Missouri, but if said Village Council deem it necessary may at anytime transfer it to any other fund in said Village.

“Section 5” Any persons, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction before the mayor shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100.00.

“Section 6” This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and posting copies of this Ordinance in four public places in the Village of Nixa, Missouri.

Re: To sanitation, a resolution was offered by Trustee Efton Hawkins, which was adopted by the Board, whereupon Trustee Efton Hawkins offered the following ordinances:

ORDINANCE NO. 52

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE SANITARY METHODS OF DISPOSAL OF HUMAN EXCRETA OR OTHER BODY WASTES IN THE CITY OF NIXA, CHRISTIAN COUNTY, MISSOURI.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Nixa, State of Missouri, and it is hereby Ordained by the Authority of the same.

SECTION I. That every residence and building within the city limits of Nixa in which human being reside, are employed or congregate, shall be provided with an approved method for disposal of human excreta as required by Section II of this ordinance.

SECTION II. That only the following methods for disposal of human excreta shall be permitted within the limits of the city of Nixa:

A. Whenever a residence or building is provided with one or more water flush toilets, the contents from said toilets shall be discharged into one of the following:

1. A public sewer, provided a public sewer is now or shall hereafter be located in a street or alley upon which the lot occupied by said residence or building, fronts or abuts, or provided a public sewer is otherwise within 300 feet of said residence or building and accessible.
2. A private sewage treatment plant constructed in accordance with plans approved by the State Board of Health.

B. In case a residence or building is not provided with water flush toilets, a sanitary pit privy, or other sanitary method approved by the State Board of Health shall be installed.

SECTION III. That it shall be the duty of the city council to appoint the health officer, city marshal, or their authorized representative, to make an inspection of the methods of disposal of sewage within the city of Nixa, within 30 days after the passage of this ordinance and as frequently thereafter as is necessary to secure compliance with this ordinance. Written notification of any violation of this ordinance

shall be given by the health officer, city marshal, or their authorized representative to the owner and occupant of the property upon which the violation occurs. If the provisions of this ordinance have not been complied with within the period of 30 days following date of notice of violation, the city shall have the right to make or have made such alterations in the method of disposal of sewage within the limits of Nixa that are deemed necessary by the health officer or city marshal to meet the requirements of this ordinance and all the cost thereof shall be provided for and defrayed by a special tax bill to be assessed in favor of the city against the property on which said improvements are made and such special tax bill shall become a lien on said property.

SECTION IV. That it shall be the duty of the owner of any premises within the limits of the city of Nixa where human beings reside, are employed or congregate, to provide a sanitary method of sewage disposal complying with this ordinance.

SECTION V. That it shall be the duty of the occupants of each premise to maintain in a sanitary condition at all times the sewage disposal system serving such premise, and it shall be unlawful for anyone to abuse or misuse said privy or other toilet device. No wash water, garbage, or kitchen slop, shall be emptied into any privy or closet receptacle.

SECTION VI. That it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm, association, or corporation, within the limits of the City of Nixa to throw out, deposit, or in any other way dispose of sewage other than as provided for in this ordinance.

SECTION VII. That any person, persons, firm, association, or corporation, or the agent thereof, who shall neglect, fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and when convicted shall be fined in the sum of not less than \$1.00 or more than \$10.00 and each day that such person, persons, firm, association, or corporation, shall neglect, fail or refuse to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense and punishable as herein provided.

SECTION VIII. That all ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict with this ordinance be and at the same time are hereby repealed, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

SECTION IX. Definition of terms.

1. Sewage. The term sewage as used in this ordinance shall be construed to mean the bowel and kidney discharges of human beings.
2. Health Officer and City Marshal. The terms health officer and city marshal as used in this ordinance shall be construed to mean the persons appointed to said positions according to the laws governing such appointments, or person or persons authorized to act as their agent.

Section I. An ordinance repealing Ordinance No. 22, Bill No. 22, approved on the 14th day of November 1902, relating to license tax.

Section 2. Repealing Ordinance No. 6A, Bill No. 6A, approved on the 15th day of February 1905, relating to license tax.

Section 3. Repealing certain sections as described below of Ordinance 14, Bill No. 14, approved the 17th day of July, 1905 and enacting new sections in lieu of said sections, and adding other sections as described below in this ordinance.

Section I is hereby repealed and a new section enacted in lieu thereof, Section I to be known as Section IA.

Section I is hereby repealed and a new section enacted in lieu thereof, Section I to be known as Section IA.

Section No. IA shall read as follows:

The following persons and vocations are required to pay a license tax before they can engage in their respective kinds of business, to-wit: Be rooms where beer is sold by the bottle or deposited for sale, auctioneers, druggists, pawnbrokers, hawkers, peddlers, bankers, brokers, merchants of all kinds, grocers, confectioners, restaurants, butchers, creameries or butter factories, public boarding houses, dram shops, saloons, liquor sellers, billiard and pool tables and other gaming tables, bowling alleys, lumber dealers, furniture dealers and undertakers, real estate agents, loan agents, public buildings, public halls, photographers, bill posters, circuses, operatic troops and shows, stock yards, insurance agents, drayage and cartage of property; and to license, tax, regulated or suppress ordinaries and agencies, public masquerades, balls, street exhibitions, dance houses, fortune tellers, pistol of shooting galleries, skating rinks, horoscopic views, telescopic views, lung testers, tenpin alleys, ball alleys, tippling houses; to license, tax and regulate magic lantern shows, doll and cane racks, knife boards, shooting galleries, millers and milling plants, canning factories, street fakirs, produce and feed stores, swings, merry-go-rounds, and persons advertising goods, wares or medicine on the streets or within the corporate limits, theatre and talking or moving picture shows, cheese factories, filling stations, garages, machine shops, telephone companies, blacksmith shops, and all other avocations whatsoever.

Section No. 5 is hereby repealed and a new section enacted in lieu thereof, Section No. 5 to be known as Section No. 5B.

Section No. 5B shall read as follows:

There shall be levied and collected, before any licenses are granted, for any business, occupation, trade or object hereinafter specified, a license tax, as follows: Auctioneers, \$1.00 per day; peddlers, \$1.00 per day; hawkers \$1.00 per day; banks \$10.00 per annum; general merchandise stores \$10.00 each per annum; hardware stores \$10.00 each per annum; millinery stores \$1.00 each per annum; blacksmith shops \$1.50 each per annum; pool or billiard tables \$30.00 each per annum; jewelry stores \$5.00 each per annum; feed stores \$4.00 each per annum; hotels or boarding houses \$1.50 each per annum; jacks and stallions kept for public use \$2.00 each per annum; machine or tool houses \$1.50 each per annum; mills or milling plants \$6.00 per annum; furniture and undertaking dealers \$5.00 each per annum; stationery, book and drug stores \$10.00 each per annum; photograph galleries \$1.00 each per annum; public scales \$1.00 each per annum; lumbar dealers \$5.00 each per annum; barbers and tonsorial artists \$2.00 per annum; real estate and insurance agencies combined \$2.00 per annum; butcher shops \$3.00 each per annum; public lecturers (if an admission fee is charged) \$1.00 per lecture; shooting galleries \$3.00 each per annum; and by the day, 50 cents per day; cane or doll rack or knife board \$1.00 per day; for advertising goods, wares or patent medicines for sale upon the streets, the sum of \$1.00 per day; cheese factories and creameries \$20.00 per annum; theaters with talking or moving pictures \$6.00 per annum; confectionery, restaurant, short orders \$5.00 per annum; garage and filling station \$5.00 per annum; machine and blacksmith shops when combined \$4.00 per annum; and telephone companies \$1.50 per annum. But no license herein provided for shall be issued for a period of less than six months, unless otherwise provided for.

Section No. 6. Every person, firm or corporation selling beer or malt liquor of more than 3.2% alcohol by weight and less than 5% alcohol by weight shall pay an annual license tax of \$100.00.

Section No. 7. Every person, firm or corporation who shall offer for sale intoxicating liquor, in the original package, except beer or malt liquor with less than 5% alcohol by weight, shall pay an annual license of \$150.00.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF NIXA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. No person shall stop and park any motor vehicle upon any alley, street or public thoroughfare within the City of Nixa, Missouri, without stopping and parking such motor vehicle in the manner required of this ordinance and other ordinances of the City of Nixa, Missouri.

Section 2. All motor vehicles hereafter stopped or parked along that part of Main Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route 123 for its entire length through the City of Nixa, Missouri shall be drawn up along the curb in such a manner that the part of said vehicle most remote from the right hand curb shall not extend into the street and/or highway more than eight (8) feet from the said curb.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person operating a motor vehicle to angular park said motor vehicle upon Main Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 123 and upon Vernon Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 14 for their entire length through the City of Nixa, Missouri.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person operating a motor vehicle to double park said motor vehicle on Main Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 123 and upon Vernon Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 14 for their entire length through the City of Nixa, Missouri

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person operating a motor vehicle to stop and park said motor vehicle on Main Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 123 closer than thirty (30) feet to the property line on the South side of intersection of Vernon Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 14.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person operating a motor vehicle to stop and park on the east and west side of State Highway Route 123 and/or Main Street closer than one hundred (100) feet to the north property line of State Highway Route No. 14 and/or Vernon Street.

ORDINANCE NO. 73

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING OPERATORS OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF NIXA, MISSOURI, TO USE THE HIGHEST DEGREE OF CARE; PROVIDED THAT THE OPERATION OF A MOTOR VEHICLE IN EXCESS OF TWENTY FIVE (25) MILES PER HOUR FOR A DISTANCE OF TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET UPON CERTAIN STREETS AND/OR HIGHWAYS SHALL BE PRESUMPTIVE BUT NOT CONCLUSIVE OF A LACK OF CARE; PROVIDED, IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON CERTAIN STREETS AND/OR HIGHWAYS IN EXCESS OF THIRTY (30) MILES PER HOUR; REQUIRING OPERATORS OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO STOP AT CERTAIN STREETS AND/OR HIGHWAY INTERSECTIONS; AUTHORIZING THE ERECTION OF WARNING SIGNS; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS; DEFINING CERTAIN WORDS AND PHRASES AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF NIXA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Defining Certain Words and Phrases. The following words and phrases when used in this ordinance shall for the purpose of this ordinance have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this article.

(a) MOTOR VEHICLE: Every vehicle which is self-propelled and every vehicle which is propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated upon rails.

(b) TRAFFIC: Pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, street cars and other conveyances either single or together while using any street for purposes of travel.

(c) STOP: When required means complete cessation of movement.

(d) STOP OR STOPPING: When prohibited means any stopping of a vehicle except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the direction of a police officer or traffic control sign or signal.

(e) PERSON: Every natural person, firm, co-partnership, association, or corporation.

(f) PEDESTRIAN: Any person afoot.

(g) STREET OR HIGHWAY: The entire width between property lines of every way or place of whatever nature when any part thereof is open to the use of the public, as a matter of right, for purposes of vehicular traffic.

(h) INTERSECTION: The areas embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines, or, if none, then the lateral boundary lines of the roadways of two highways which join one another at, or approximately at, right angles, or the area within which vehicles traveling upon different highways joining at any other angle may come in conflict.

(i) SAFETY ZONE: The area or space officially set apart within a roadway for the exclusive use of pedestrians and which is protected or is so marked or indicated by adequate signs as to be plainly visible at all times while set apart as a safety zone.

(j) OFFICIAL TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES: All signs, markings, and devices not inconsistent with this ordinance placed or erected by authority of a public body or official having jurisdiction, for the purpose of regulation, warning, guiding traffic.

SECTION 2. Every person operating a motor vehicle on any public street, alley or highway in the City of Nixa, Missouri, shall operate the same in a careful and prudent manner and shall exercise the highest degree of care, and at a rate of speed so as not to endanger the property of others or the life or limb of any person, PROVIDED, that a rate of speed in excess of twenty five (25) miles per hour for a distance of two hundred (200) feet on that part of Main Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 123 lying and being from the South city limits of Nixa, Missouri, to a distance three hundred (300) feet North of the Church of Christ, shall be considered as evidence presumptive but not conclusive of driving at a rate of speed which is not careful and prudent, but the burden of proof shall continue to be on the prosecution to show by competent evidence that at the time and place charged the operator was driving at a rate of speed which was not careful and prudent considering all conditions at said time and place, PROVIDED, that a rate of speed in excess of twenty five (25) miles per hour for a distance of two hundred (200) feet on that part of Vernon Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 14 from West city limits to a distance eight hundred (800) feet East of intersection of Main Street and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 123 and Vernon and/or Missouri State Highway Route No. 14 shall be considered as evidence presumptive but not conclusive of driving at a rate of speed which is not careful and prudent, but the burden or proof shall continue to be on the prosecution to show by competent evidence that at the time and place charged the operator was driving at a rate of speed which was not careful and prudent considering all conditions at said time and place.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, regardless of conditions and care or lack of care exercised, to operate a motor vehicle at a rate of speed in excess of thirty (30) miles per hour upon any alley, street and/or highway within the confines of the City of Nixa, Missouri.

SECTION 4. Every person operating a motor vehicle in the City of Nixa, Missouri, shall come to a complete stop before driving onto or across any street upon which any state highway is now or may hereafter be routed.

SECTION 5. The State Highway Commission of Missouri, its employees, and/or the proper officials or employees of the City of Nixa, Missouri, are and shall be authorized to paint or erect stop and speed signs on the surface or by the side of the traveled portion of streets and highways as a warning to motor vehicle operators.

SECTION 6. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars and not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, together with the costs of prosecution.

SECTION 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with, contrary to, or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE TO EMPLOY AN ATTORNEY FOR THE VILLAGE OF NIXA, MISSOURI AND FIX HIS COMPENSATION.
