ORDINANCE NO. 76

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NIXA, MISSOURI AS  
FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

An ordinance repealing that portion of Sec. B5 of Ordinance No. 56, as approved February 20, 1935 relative to the licensing of Medicine Shows and Auctions.

Section 2.

There shall be levied and collected, before any license is granted, the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per day for any person, firm or corporation, desiring to advertise goods, wares or patent medicines for sale inside the corporate limits, or for medicine shows where patent medicines are sold, or on auction sales where any line of merchandise is to be sold, but excluding public auctions that may be held by private individuals, who are disposing of their personal property of affects.

BILL NO. 77

ORDINANCE NO. 77

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Nixa, Nixa, Missouri as follows:

SECTION I.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 79

AN ORDINANCE accepting the proposal of the Blackwell Cheese Co., Inc., Nixa Division, and Consolidated Products Company, a corporation, heretofore presented, to enlarge and otherwise improve certain portions of the sewage, sewerage and disposal lines belonging to and maintained and operated by the Village of Nixa and being a part of the sewer system of the Village of Nixa, said sewage, sewerage, and disposal lines being more particularly located South of a certain pond located South of State Highway No. 14 and West of the High School, in the Village of Nixa, for the reason that the sewage, sewerage and disposal lines heretofore existing South of said pond have been inadequate to drain the surface waters and other sewage and disposal draining into said pond from the Village of Nixa;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NIXA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: THAT WHEREAS, The Blackwell Cheese Co., Inc. Nixa Division, and Consolidated Products Company, a corporation have offered to enlarge and otherwise improve certain portions of the sewage, sewerage, and disposal lines belonging to and maintained and operated by the Village of Nixa and being a part of the sewer system of the Village of Nixa, said sewage, sewerage, and disposal lines being more particularly located South of a certain pond located South of State Highway No. 14 and West of the high school, in the Village of Nixa, for the reason that the sewage, sewerage and disposal lines heretofore existing South of said pond have been inadequate to drain the surface waters and other sewage and disposal draining into said pond from the Village of Nixa, said offer is hereby in all things accepted, and it is hereby declared;

SECTION 2: That the Village of Nixa does not accept all such improvements made by said Blackwell Cheese Co., Inc., Nixa Division, and Consolidated Products company, a corporation, to its sewer system and does ordain that it will hereafter keep and maintain said sewage, sewerage, and disposal lines in good order and repair;

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication in the Christian County Republican, a newspaper of general circulation in the Village of Nixa, Missouri, for two consecutive weeks.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 5B OF ORDINANCE NO. 56, PERTAINING TO THE LICENSE TAX ON POOL TABLES, AS APPROVED ON FEBRUARY 20, 1935, AND AMENDED ON THE 16TH DAY OF JANUARY 1939, BY ORDINANCE NO. 63.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nixa, Missouri, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Ordinance No. 63 of the City of Nixa, Missouri is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof.

SECTION TWO: It shall be unlawful for any person to operate pool tables within the limits of the City of Nixa, Missouri without first having secured from said City a license to operate same and for such license to operate said pool tables said licensee shall pay as follows: For the first table, the sum of Thirty (\$30.00) Dollars; for the second table, the sum of Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars; and for each pool table thereafter, the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars; said money to be paid to the City of Nixa, Missouri; and said City of Nixa, Missouri reserves the right to refuse to grant a license to any applicant for cause and may for cause shown revoke any license heretofore granted.

SECTION THREE: Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of Five (\$5.00) Dollars for each day that he operates such pool hall within the limits of the City of Nixa, Missouri.
