

## Issue: AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NIXA AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE II OF THE NIXA CITY CODE TO ESTABLISH NEW CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS BASED ON THE 2020 DECENNIAL CENSUS

## **Background**

The Nixa Home Rule Charter provides for a City Council of two members per District (Section 3.2) and for three total Districts that shall be established by ordinance following each decennial census (Section 9.4). Nixa Home Rule Charter Section 9.4 also provides that the Districts shall comprise compact and contiguous territory and shall contain, as nearly as possible, an equal number of inhabitants.

The requirement to contain, as nearly as possible, an equal number of inhabitants is further qualified by a variety of constitutional, statutory, and other legal provisions (i.e., Court decisions). These qualifiers can be summarized into a list of working priorities for conducting the redistricting process. This list of priorities includes the following:

- 1. Population Equivalence (<10% deviation from ideal district population)
- 2. Compact and Contiguous
- 3. Retention of Existing Neighborhoods
- 4. Retention of Precinct Boundaries
- 5. Cohesion of Other Existing Communities of Interest
- 6. Retention of Historic Boundaries
- 7. Consideration of Incumbency

In late August of 2021, the United State Census Bureau released an initial tranche of population data designed to aid governments in their redistricting processes. Nixa City staff was able to access this data and refine it to determine population counts at the Census Block level of analysis. This data was then used to develop alternative redistricting options while adhering to the priorities listed above. Two options were presented to the City Council in September of this year and a subcommittee of the City Council was subsequently formed to further study the options and make a recommendation to the full Council.

The subcommittee formed for this purpose met on September 20, 2021 where staff provided a description of how the options were formed and how they adhered to the priorities provided by law. The subcommittee voted unanimously to recommend Option A, a copy of which accompanies this exhibit and is also described in the associated bill.



## <u>Analysis</u>

The data provided by the U.S. Census Bureau indicates that Nixa's 2020 population is 23,278. The ideal district population then is 7,759. The redistricting proposal contained in this bill provides for compact and contiguous districts that appropriately satisfies the stated priorities and achieves a district population deviation from the ideal of less than 6 percent. This proposal was preferred to the alternative option considered by the subcommittee because it provides for more equivalent district populations.

As discussed by the subcommittee, future population growth is not considered in the redistricting process because it is speculative.

## **Recommendation**

City staff and the subcommittee formed to study this issue recommend the approval of this bill.

**SECTION 5:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final passage by the City Council and after its approval by the Mayor, subject to the provisions of section 3.11(g) of the City Charter.
