

# RE: ORDINANCE CALLING FOR AN ELECTION TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS THE QUESTION OF IMPOSING A 3/4-CENT TAX TO FUND POLICE

## Background:

The City of Nixa has grown significantly over the last several years. In 1987 the City's population was fewer than 4,700 people. Today we stand at over 24,000 residents. Along with this growth comes challenges. Among some of those challenges are the need for additional Parks facilities, additional office space in the police department and the need to hire additional police officers.

The most recent staffing study showed the need for 11 additional officers to keep up with the growing number of calls for service. Unfortunately, due to limited revenues we were not able to afford any additional police officers again in the 2023 budget year. This is the third year in a row that we have been unable to budget additional officers due to limited revenues. As discussed before, the police department is currently maxed out on available space. There is currently no office space open, and they have had to find alternative space to secure evidence and found property. Insight Design Architects worked with staff to provide a design for a new police department that would meet not only their current need for space but is designed to handle the anticipated growth for the next 20 years.

In November of 2022, a 1-cent General Sales Tax ballot issue failed that would have provided funds to address the police and park's needs. Although the tax initiative failed, the needs are still present. During discussions at the last City Council meeting, it was decided to bring back an ordinance that would place a 3/4 -cent general sales tax dedicated to law enforcement back to City Council at the next meeting. If passed this would allow us to start addressing these public safety needs immediately and alleviate the amount of funds that are being transferred from the general fund.

# Analysis:

The City of Nixa's current available revenues are not sufficient to completely address any of the above needs. For example, the City of Nixa collected about 3.6 million dollars last year in general sales tax revenue. Personnel and operating expenses for the police department in 2022 were approximately 4.3 million.



Nixa Finance Director Jennifer Evans completed a 7-year general fund forecast utilizing anticipated revenues and expenses, including the 5-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) program that was approved in 2022. At the current rate of expenses and revenues, the forecast shows our net ending cash in the negative by the end of 2025. This is largely due to the amount of transfer that is needed from the general fund to cover the police department expenses.

The only way to be able to completely address the need for the additional officers, the need for additional office space and to alleviate the pressure on the general fund in the foreseeable future would be to ask the public to consider a general sales tax increase. Currently, the total sales tax rate within the City of Nixa is 7.475%. When you look at the City of Nixa's portion of the sales tax, we are collecting 1.5%, with only 1% going to the general fund. The 1% general sales tax has not changed since its inception in 1987, and despite our larger population and continued growth it is below our neighboring cities tax rates. The current 1-cent sales tax brought in around 3.6 million dollars in 2022 and the use tax brought in around \$851,331. If the public were to choose to approve an additional 3/4-cent sales tax, it would bring in an additional estimated 3.7 to 4 million dollars. These additional funds would allow us to address the immediate public safety needs.

## **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends the approval of the ordinance calling for an election to be held on April 4, 2023, asking the public to impose a 3/4-cent sales tax to fund police.

10	WHEREAS the City is authorized pursuant to the Missouri Constitution and				
11	Sections 94.500 through 94.550 RSMo., to impose a general city sales tax; and

13	WHEREAS the City currently collects a one cent sales tax for general municipal				
14	purposes and a half cent sales tax for street purposes; and

16	WHEREAS the general one cent sales tax rate has existed at its current level since				
17	1987; and				
18	MUEREAD the Delice Demonstrates founded through the Other new and found				
19 20	WHEREAS the Police Department is funded through the City's general fund				
20	because they do not have a dedicated funding source; and				
21	WHEREAS in 2021 Police Department expanditures were over \$2.7 million while

28	WHEREAS the City has since more than doubled again, cresting 24,000 residents				
29	in 2021 according to the U.S. Census Bureau, making Nixa the second-largest				
30	municipality in the Springfield-Branson metro area; and

32	WHEREAS a staffing study of the Nixa Police Department demonstrated that the				
33	department requires an additional 11 officers to adequately serve the Nixa community,				
34	yet a facilities and use of space study indicated that the Police Department Headquarters				
35	needs to double in size to properly accommodate current staffing numbers, let alone any				
36	additional staff; and

38	WHEREAS the City of Republic collects a 3.13 cent sales tax, the City of Ozark				
39	collects a 2.375 cent sales tax, the cities of Bolivar, Webb City, and Mt. Vernon each

The City Clerk is further authorized and directed to do all things necessary and convenient to ensure that the question is properly submitted to the voters on April 4, 2023, including, without limitation, submitting a different ballot from the form approved Section 1 of this Ordinance, so long as the question submitted to the voters is substantially the same as the question authorized in Section 1 of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall also provide a certified copy of the notice of election, which is attached hereto as "Council Bill Exhibit A." Said notice of election shall be in substantially similar form as the document attached hereto as "Council Bill Exhibit A."
87 88 89	<b>SECTION 3:</b> The Clerk of Christian County, Missouri is hereby authorized to conduct an election in a manner consistent with the provisions of Chapter 115, RSMo.

90	<b>SECTION 4:</b> The City Administrator, and other officers of the City, are hereby						
91	authorized and directed to take such other actions as may be necessary or convenient to						
92	carry out the purpose and intent of this Ordinance.

94	<b>SECTION 5:</b> Upon approval, by the qualified voters of the City, of the question						
95	herein submitted by this Ordinance the additional sales tax contemplated herein shall be						
96	levied, in addition to any other sales taxes levied by the City, within the City limits of the						
97	City of Nixa, Missouri. The City Administrator, or designee, shall thereafter be authorized						
98	and directed to provide certified copies of this Ordinance, and any other information which						
99	may be necessary or convenient, to the Director of Revenue of the State of Missouri.

101	SECTION 6: If the proposed city sales tax is not approved by a majority of the						
102	votes cast by the qualified voters voting thereon, then this Ordinance shall be of no effect,						
103	and the sales tax proposed herein shall not be effective, however, the failure of this						
104	proposition to receive the requisite majority vote shall have no effect on any other sales						
105	tax levied or imposed by the City. Nothing herein is intended to be nor shall be deemed						
106	as an abolition of any other tax levied by the City.
